From 1997-2002, I was an associate at Fried, Frank, Harris, Shriver, and Jacobson in Washington D.C., before moving to Bryan Cave, where I was senior counsel from 2002-2010. At Bryan Cave, I represented clients before securities regulators, conducted internal investigations for audit committees, and helped design corporate compliance programs.

In May 2010, I returned to Charlottesville to be closer to my aging parents, who retired to Lake Monticello in 1991. Since returning to Charlottesville, I have worked at CFA Institute, where I conduct investigations into the ethical and professional lapses of our members.
